<u>**2D ANIMATION</u>** Students will learn the basics of bringing a character to life, using Toon Boom Harmony. Frame-by-frame and rigged puppet animation will be discussed.</u>

**<u>GAME DESIGN</u>** Students will gain hands-on experience working in the Unity game engine. The Unity engine is one of the two most widely used engines in the industry. Students will get to build their own game levels from asset libraries and learn about level design. *(Prior programming experience is not required.)*

**DRAWING** Whether students are interested in studio art, concept design for gaming, or comics and graphic novels, knowing how to draw is an essential skill for creative communication. Students will experience a fast-paced introduction to drawing at a professional level. Fundamental drawing techniques will be demonstrated and practiced. All materials are provided. (*This course is ideal for students with limited /no experience in drawing.*)

**<u>CERAMICS</u>** Students will learn new hand-building/wheel-throwing techniques. Students will be able to complete one or more projects. Students should bring boxes to store their ceramic work.
